## **PHARMACY FIRST SCHEME**

When you request an appointment, with a doctor via our text message service your request will be triaged and you will be booked with the most appropriate member of the clinical team. You may be booked with one of our additional roles -Clinical Pharmacist or Advanced Nurse Practitioner. We may also refer you to the Pharmacy First Scheme which is a service commissioned by NHS England. Listed over the page are the medical conditions that the Pharmacist First Scheme can treat

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<b>Pharmacy First Medical Conditions</b>	<b>Age range</b>
Acute Otitis Media	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites	1 year and over
Shingles	18 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Sore throat	5 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract infections	Women 16-64 years

Having additional roles and the Pharmacy first Scheme means that our GP's can focus their skills where they are most needed, for example on diagnosing and treating patients with more complex conditions.
